

Girling Angling Society - Fladbury LB Fishery Peg by Peg - June 2021

Match Pegs 1-26 - Lock Stream Pegs 27-35

Park behind all 35 Pegs - In the Winter months a downstream raised Car Park is available.

Peg	Description of Peg	Form	Methods / Tactics
1	The Chub end peg. Access is from the Car Park. Cabbages in front of you, flow on far side, flow tends to push the float into the near bank under the tree so you have to go long. Great winter waggler peg when the cabbages have died down.	21lb Carp and 5lb Bream caught in Oct. 2018 40 Chub caught opposite on waggler in 2017. Barbel regularly caught on the opposite bank.	Waggler/ Feeder/ Pole Try the long Pole, Waggler or Feeder beyond the nearside cabbages.
2	The Winter Peg. Wide here, some flow near side, main flow well over past the centre of the river, lots of fish close in downstream. Deep under the tree. Good all year round Peg. Watch out for the resident Pike.	Regularly wins matches on the pole or Waggler all year round. Quality Roach area, watch for Pike.	Stick/ Waggler/ Pole/ Feeder Trot down towards peg 1 at two or three rod lengths out.
3	The Pole Peg. Middle of the bay, wide, no flow near side, main flow well over. Winter peg, good with a bit of extra water on. Watch out for the resident Pike.	Regularly wins winter matches especially if peg 4 is vacant. Winter Peg, can struggle in the Summer.	Pole/ Waggler/ Feeder Roach and Dace on Waggler or pole. Perch down the inside. Waggler down if peg 2 vacant.
4	Upstream bay peg. Waggler or feeder over into the flow or you can trot through with the flow & ease it into the slack water in the Bay.	Regularly wins especially if peg 3 is vacant. Perch on the Feeder, Try feeding heavy on the stick.	
5	Cables. You can trot through on the inside but main flow on far side. Deep hole under the tree. Overhead cables.	Big Chub and Roach area. Won a 2017 match on the Stick Float.	
6	Cables. You can trot through on the inside but main flow on far side. Overhead Cables.	Regular winner, 6lb Chub in 2015.	
7	The Deep peg. You can trot through on the inside but main flow on far side. Slightly deeper.	Has won a couple of matches since new platform in March 2017, occasional Bream, big Chub to 5 or 6lb, lots of Roach.	
8	You can trot through on the inside but main flow on far side. Deeper than the upstream peg	Big Chub area	
9	The Shallows. Shallow with stalks up to a third over, becoming a Waggler - Feeder peg.	Shallow nearside, no recent form	
10	The shallower peg. Slightly shallower, main flow on far side, good peg with a bit of colour, shallows up downstream.	Has won matches in the past but goes missing when low or clear.	
11	The Chub Peg. On the inside of a bend & shallows up towards peg 10, main flow far side.	Won 4 matches in 2017 best 17lb of Chub on Stick and Waggler.	
12	First peg round the bend. Often has a nice glide. Main flow far side. Lots of submerged stalks.	Has won matches in the past, can throw up a weight past the middle beyond the submerged stalks.	Whip / Stick/ Waggler / Pole/ Feeder
13	The Roach peg. River starts to bend left here, has a perfect pace for the stick float down the inside & the middle. Pacier over the far side.	Regular match winner. Chub, Roach & Dace with the odd small Barbel. Some big weights of Roach, lots of Pike.	Chub, Roach and Dace on the inside and middle, Chub and Hybrids on the Waggler, Chub and Perch on the feeder. The occasional Barbel show up.
14		Quality Roach on Hempseed July 2020 Two big Chub lost with the river up October 2020	
15		Won a match with 7lb of Hybrids Aug. 2017.	
16	Even depth, good flow on the inside, stronger flow far side, lots of marginal reeds, pacier far side.	6lb of Hybrids Aug. 2017, 8lb Barbel 2015	These pegs are directly below the weir with the flow on the far side and a nice glide down the inside.
17		11lb of Chub & Hybrids 2017	All species but methods influenced by conditions.
18		Hybrids occasionally	Peg 20 is a waggler peg over into the flow from the Mill Stream
19	The Stick Float peg. Good flow on the inside stronger flow far side but can be pacy with extra water on. Even depth through & beyond peg 18.	Regular match winner. 10lb June 2017 on Waggler & 12lb Aug. 2017 on the whip.	Peg 21 with the Mill Stream influx opposite, most use a heavy stick down the middle.
20	Below the Mill stream peg. Good glide but can be pacy when affected by the far bank Mill stream influx.	Has won matches in the past. Won with 14lb of Feeder Chub July 2020	Peg 22 super glide tends to be full of small fish
21	The Mill Stream peg. Nice glide on the inside, opposite the Mill stream influx, always turbulent far side.	Has won matches in the past. 10lb on the whip Sept. 2016.	
22	First Glide. Nice flow on the inside, river starts to glide here after the weir turbulence. Upstream of the Mill stream influx.	Regularly frames, 11lb on the whip July 2017 Won Oct. 2018 with 6lb of small Dace.	
23	The Bageing Peg. Pacey, flow starts to move away from your bank here, can be boily, difficult to get your bait down. Steadier down the middle.	Regular match winner. 12lb mixed bag 2017. Match record peg, 33lb of Chub in 2016	Barble, Chub & Dace under your feet or down the middle. Far side back eddy full of bits. Use a bait dropper and hold back a heavy Stick float or Chubber.
24	The Barbel Peg. Pacy, the flow is under your feet and difficult to get your bait down. 9ft & steadier down the middle. Can be boily, flow seems to fluctuate. Shallow back eddy far side.	24lb of Chub 2014, 3 Barbel best 6lb September 2016, 8lb July 2017 when a bit clear. 13lb on the Whip Aug. 2018. 10lb Barbel pleasure fishing September 2019.	Loafer / Stick / Waggler / Feeder, feed with a bait dropper.
25	The Washing Machine peg. So called because the weir flow hits the bank here and its always boily on the inside, less boily down the middle (9ft) but getting your bait down is the problem. Flow fluctuates.	Chub and Barbel peg, not included When extra water on. 12lb of Chub July 2016, inc. 7lb Barbel on the heavy Stick in June 2017. Won with 13lb on the whip July 2017	Loafer for Barble and Chub under your feet & down the margin, often easier fishing down the middle on a big stick using a bait dropper. Far side back eddy full of bits.
26	The Whip peg in the Boat channel. The peg is in the mouth of the cutting, the boat channel is near side, depth 6ft which deepens downstream but often still, a triangle of slack water over to the point of the island with a torrent from the weir coming through the far side. The boats come in close (watch your keepnet), flow in the channel affected by the lock, lots of options. Great peg with a bit of water on.	Regular match winner especially with extra water on. 11lb 4oz of Small Chub and Dace on the whip September 2016. Big Carp caught by Associate member fishing in the evening. Big Barbel Area with water on, Lots of options Big Roach July 2020 on Hemp seed	Whip / Pole /Stick / Waggler / Feeder Lots of bits up in the water on a 3m whip, all Species on the Pole over to the slack triangle inc. Barbel, Carp, Chub & Skimmers. Perch, Roach & Dace trotting through the boat channel which deepens further down, Perch on the feeder end of channel just before the channel meets the flow from the weir.
27	Winter Bageing Peg. Just inside the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury island, superb with a bit of water on.		These Nine Pegs are available on match days.
28	Second peg in the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury Island		Excellent winter pegs when the river is up and boat traffic reduces.
29	Third peg in the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury Island.		The Lock Stream pegs are affected by summer Boat traffic and fluctuating flow from lock use.
30	Fourth peg in the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury Island.		Peg 27 is excellent when the river back's up and the peg deepens.
31	Fifth peg in the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury Island		The Channel is wider and deeper in pegs 32 to 35, these pegs are built on an old mooring, 6ft deep nearside with great views of the weir.
32	Pegs 32 - 35 are set lower built on an old mooring.	9 pegs built June 2020 and not yet assessed.	Peg 32 & 33 have a wide grassy bank with four steps.
33	Seventh peg in the Lock Stream, opposite Fladbury Island with views of the weir, the peg is in between some old willows, the channel is wider here, 6ft deep nearside. Set low on an old mooring	There are reports of large Pike and Perch and signs of Bream towards the lock gates.	Peg 34 has a gentle slope, handrail with no steps.
34	Peg 34 has a Grass Bank, handrail and no steps. Disabled Peg with a Handrail, no Steps. Opposite Fladbury Island with views of the weir. The channel is wider here. Reeds far side, 5ft deep nearside. Set low on an old mooring.		Peg 35 is accessed from peg 34 having a platform with the channel in front and the stream to your right. You can reach the concrete mooring with a short pole, a little awkward with an old willow behind the peg.
35	Peg 35 has a platform and no steps nearest to the lock gates. Platform, Handrail, no Steps. The end peg in the Lock Stream opposite Fladbury Island with views of the weir. Accessed from peg 34, the channel is wider here. Reeds far side, mouth of the stream and Lock gates to the right. 5ft deep nearside. Set low on an old mooring, the Platform is in front of an old Willow Tree.		Reports of Specimen Pike and Perch and signs of Bream but not yet exploited.
